Fiction

Duck, Duck, Dinosaur by: **Kallie George** Just when the game was getting to be fun, in came trouble.
DRA J

Life by Cynthia Rylant A gorgeous story, told through the eyes of animals that reminds us that life is full of change and wonder. Ages 6-9

King of the Sky by **Nicola Davies** A young boy who's emigrated from Rome to Wales feels alone and alienated. Grades 1-4

Nothing Rhymes with Orange by **Adam Rex** We all know nothing rhymes with orange, but how does that make Orange feel? Well, left out, obviously! Grades K-3

It Came in the Mail by **Ben Clanton** A clever story that reminds us to be careful what we wish for. Delightful word choice ('diddle-squat' and 'squibble wibble whoop'!) make this a fun one to read aloud over and over. Grades K-3

Black Cowboy, Wild Horses: A True Story by **Julius Lester** Bob Lemmons is famous for his ability to track wild horses. He rides his horse, Warrior, picks up the trail of mustangs, then runs with them day and night until they accept his presence. Grades 1-3

Freedom Summer by **Deborah Wiles** Joe and John Henry are a lot alike. They both like shooting marbles, they both want to be firemen, and they both love to swim. But there's one important way they're different: Joe is white and John Henry is black and in the South in 1964, that means John Henry isn't allowed to do everything his best friend is. Grades K-2

Wangari's Tree of Peace: A True Story From Africa by **Jeanette Winter** As a young girl growing up in Kenya, Wangari was surrounded by trees. But years later when she returns home, she is shocked to see whole forests being cut down, and she knows that soon all the trees will be destroyed. So Wangari decides to do something—and starts by planting nine seedlings in her own backyard. And as they grow, so do her plans. This true story of Wangari Maathai, environmentalist and winner of the Nobel Peace Prize. Grades K-3

The Quickest Kid in Clarksville by **Pat Zietlow Miller & Frank Morrison** It's 1961, and sweet, spunky Alta wants to be the fastest runner in Clarksville, TN, just like her idol, three-time Olympic gold medalist Wilma Rudolph. Ages 5-8

Biographies

Moses by **Carole Boston Weatherford** This poetic book is a resounding tribute to Tubman's strength, humility, and devotion. Grades 3-5

A Lesson for Martin Luther King Jr. by **Denise Lewis Patrick** Young Martin Luther King Jr. is having some problems with his best friend, Bobby. First, they are going to different schools this year. Next, Bobby's dad is not letting his son play with Martin. When Martin learns why, he is confused and hurt -- but he learns a lesson that he will never forget. Grade 2

A Boy Named Boomer by **Boomer Esiason** American football player. Grade 2

Molly, By Golly! By **Dianne Ochiltree** This legendary tale introduces young readers to Molly Williams, an African American cook for New York City's Fire Company 11, who is considered to be the first known female firefighter in U.S. history. DRA 20

Non-Fiction/STEAM

I, Fly: The Buzz About Flies and How Awesome They Are by Bridget Heos For kids who like to be grossed out. Told from the point of view of the fly who is irritated by everyone's fascination with butterflies. Grades 2+

Ice Cream Summer by: **Peter Sis** Get the scoop on some fun history, math, and new vocabulary in this entertaining book about ice cream. DRA 24

The House That Jane Built: A Story About Jane Addams by **Tanya Lee Stone** This is the story of Jane Addams, the first American woman to receive the Nobel Peace Prize, who transformed a poor neighborhood in Chicago by opening up her house as a community center. Grades 1-2

Egg: Nature's Perfect Package by **Robin Page** Hatching a plan for survival isn't always easy in the wild. And how animals lay, protect, and even use each other's eggs as a food source help reveal the life cycle of the natural world. Grades K-3

Ada Byron Lovelace and the Thinking Machine by **Laurie Wallmark** Ada Lovelace, the daughter of the famous romantic poet, Lord Byron, develops her creativity through science and math. Grades K-3

How to Code: A Step-by-Step Guide to Computer Coding by **Max Wainwright** Introduces the basic principles of coding. Learn how to give instructions and turn instructions into code. Figure out how to debug code, solve problems and use algorithms. Grades 2-3

Hello Ruby: Adventures in Coding by **Linda Liukas** Meet Ruby—a small girl with a huge imagination, and the determination to solve any puzzle. As Ruby stomps around her world making new friends, including the Wise Snow Leopard, the Friendly Foxes, and the Messy Robots, kids will be introduced to the fundamentals of computational thinking, like how to break big problems into small ones, create step-by-step plans, look for patterns and think outside the box through storytelling. When obstacles like racism, poverty, and sexism threatened this goal, she persevered—brightening the world with a game-changing treatment for blindness! Grades K-5

Grades 3-7

Why Do Dogs Bark? by **Joan Holub** There are many different kinds of dogs and so much to find out about them. Why do dogs bark, howl, or bury bones? Why do they like to lick and sniff people? What jobs can dogs do? You'll find the answers to these questions and many more in this fact-filled reader about man's best friend. DRA 20-24
